DAHLIA Description of a Dahlia for judging purposes.

Large decorative size over 210mm, Dwarf varieties do not normally grow taller than 600mm and Pom Pom size under 50mm. All blooms should be symmetrical, graceful and fresh with no buds and face forward and upwards.

ROSES Classification of Roses for Judging purposes

An Exhibition Style Rose usually has a lot of petals, a high centre and must be one to a stem. A Decorative Rose is characterised by cup-shape or loose petals or wavy petals, usually has less than 30 petals, side buds are allowed.
